9.0 Recommendations

Based on the study's findings, researchers recommended that we should adopt a holistic approach to evaluating Nigerian lecturers' intellectual dexterity, incorporating Ubuntu principles and community engagement. They also suggest investing in infrastructure and administrative support to foster a conducive academic environment. Additionally, policymakers should prioritize recognizing and rewarding community engagement and social responsibility in academic work.
